Versioning

- To avoid others running into BC-issues, follow semantic versioning (MAJOR.MINOR.PATCH)
- Ask affected version in bug reports
- Keeping a changelog can help your future self and others.

Spread the word



Introduction

The documentation here will cover advanced topics under the presumption that the reader has a basic to intermediate understanding of programming, as well as PHP, object-oriented design, and to some extent Laravel, as the articles are heavily driven by code examples.

You are of course free to skip this entire section, as you don't need to know these things to use Hyde. However, if you want to know the "magic" behind Hyde, or if you want to take advantage of these powerful tools, then by all means, please read on! 
